

DOUBLE DEGREE IN GLOBAL STUDIES/TOURISM GENERAL ENROLLMENT PROCEDURE 25/26

Dear Students,

This letter contains instructions for registering for the next academic year.

Remember:

- You must register for any subjects you have not passed before registering for new ones.
- The maximum number of credits you can enroll in per course is the number foreseen in the double degree plan (72 credits for the first course and 72 credits for the second course).
- The minimum number of credits you must enroll in per course is 40% of those specified in the plan (2nd year: 29 credits).
- You have three opportunities to pass each subject (one per course). The "not presented" grade counts as a use of the call. To prevent us from computing the call, you can request the cancellation until the date established in the academic and administrative calendar of the 25/26 course.
- It is your responsibility to choose the subjects and groups (if there is more than one).
- Before enrolling, please check the schedules of each subject's groups on the Faculty's website: <https://www.udg.edu/ca/ft/Informacio-academica/Calendaris-i-horaris>.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- According to enrollment regulations, no modifications can be made unless there are changes in the official timetable. Therefore, it is essential that you carefully select both the subjects and the specific groups to avoid timetable conflicts—especially if you are enrolling in subjects from different academic years. After completing your self-enrollment, please review your timetable to ensure there are no errors or incompatibilities. The self-enrollment platform allows modifications until 00:59 on the following day. After this time, changes will no longer be possible. Only exceptionally justified requests for rectification will be considered. These must be submitted during the incident period (July 8 to 24). Since we cannot guarantee a favorable resolution, we strongly advise you to verify your timetable both before and immediately after enrolling.
- Places in subject groups will be allocated on a first-come, first-served basis according to the order of enrollment. Once a group is full, it will no longer be available for selection.
- If you are entitled to any exemption (e.g., large family), it must be valid on the day of your enrollment. If it has been renewed during the current academic year, you must upload the updated documentation via the *La Meva* registration portal **before** enrolling, to avoid issues on enrollment day.
- Even if you were granted a scholarship last year, we recommend that you provide documentation for any other valid exemption. This will allow us to apply it in case your scholarship application is not approved.
- **Grants and Scholarships:** We recommend that you consult the UdG Scholarship Section website before enrolling: <https://www.udg.edu/ca/estudia/beques-i-ajuts/beques-de-graus>. You may apply for a conditional scholarship if you have already submitted your application and meet the academic requirements.

LANGUAGE MODULE SUBJECTS

- You may only register for language module subjects that have been previously validated by the academic secretary and the language department. If you have not indicated otherwise, these are the subjects listed in the email you received in mid-June.
If no language courses appear in the self-enrollment system, proceed with your enrollment without them and submit an incident request between July 8 and 24.
- Validation of a language subject does not guarantee a reserved place. Places are assigned strictly in order of registration.
- French and German courses start at the beginner level. To successfully follow English B2.1, it is recommended that you already have a B1 level. If not, you are encouraged to use the summer to improve your English through courses at the SLM or another language school.
- English C1.1 and English C1.1 Plus are both C1.1 level courses, but they have different content and can be taken in any order. However, English C1.1 is a compulsory course for all students.
- Groups 1A, 1B, 1C, and 1D correspond to first-semester subjects, while groups 2A, 2B, 2C, and 2D correspond to second-semester subjects. The letters A, B, C, and D indicate the timetable of each group.
- Do not enroll in a group that you cannot attend.** If the group you wish to join is full, submit an incident request to the academic secretary. Requests will be addressed before the start of the academic year, as long as places are still available.
- The complete list of language subjects and groups offered this year can be found in Annex I.
- To obtain the Tourism degree, you must complete six language courses (36 ECTS credits), including a compulsory English C1.1 course and either French B1 or German B1.1.
