

BACHELOR'S DEGREE IN GLOBAL STUDIES (study plan 3108G0424)

ENROLMENT INSTRUCTIONS

In accordance with the enrolment regulations and the regulations on permanence and progression in studies at the University of Girona:

- You must enroll in all previously failed subjects before enrolling in new ones. If you fail an elective subject, you do not need to repeat it the following year — you may replace it with a different one. The new subject will carry over the enrolment and examination attempt numbers corresponding to the replaced subject. At the time of enrolment, you will be asked to specify which subject you wish to replace.
- The total number of credits for the degree is 240
- The number of credits in a full academic year is 60
- The maximum number of credits you may enrol in per academic year is 75
- The minimum number of credits you must enrol in per academic year is 24
- You have three examination attempts to pass each subject (one per academic year). A grade of "not presented" counts as an attempt used. Therefore, to avoid using an attempt, you may request cancellation by the deadline set in the academic and administrative calendar for 2026/2027.

ATTENTION: for scholarship purposes, cancellation of an examination attempt counts as a failed subject.

It is your responsibility to choose your subjects and groups (where more than one group is available).

- The Enrolment Regulations do not permit modifications unless there have been timetable changes. It is therefore very important that you carefully select your subjects and especially your groups in order to avoid timetable clashes. Pay particular attention if you are enrolling in subjects from different years. Review your timetable after enrolment and make changes if you detect clashes or errors. The self-enrolment application allows modifications until 23:59 on the same day. After that time no changes will be possible. Only corrections in very well-justified and exceptional cases will be accepted. A request must be submitted during the incidents period (7–30 July) through the online secretariat: Secretariat → Procedures → Request to the Administration.
- Places in subject groups will be allocated according to students' enrolment order. Once all places are filled, enrolment for that group will close.
- Mobility students (Sicue/Erasmus/Prometeu) only need to select a group for the subjects you will take at UdG. Subjects you will not take at UdG will appear by default in the Study Agreement (AE) group when you load them using the "study agreement" filter on the 2nd screen of the self-enrolment application.
- If you have any type of exemption (for example, large family status), please note that it must be current on the day you enrol. Remember that if you have renewed it during this academic year, you must upload it through the procedures tab in La Meva (Documentary accreditation) before enrolling so that the corresponding price exemption is applied.
- **Scholarships. We recommend that you consult the UdG Scholarships Section website before enrolling. You will find information on both general scholarship schemes and equity scholarships** <https://www.udg.edu/ca/estudia/beques-i-ajuts/beques-de-graus>. You may enrol conditionally subject to a scholarship if you have already applied and meet the academic requirements. Even if you received a scholarship last year, we recommend that you also justify any other type of exemption you may have. Should your scholarship be denied, we will be able to apply the corresponding exemption.

ACADEMIC RECOGNITION (AR).

You will receive the 6 academic recognition credits through your international mobility period (1.5 AR credits per full month of mobility; therefore, with 4 full months of mobility you will receive the 6 AR credits).

MODULE 5 ELECTIVES

In both the second and third year, you must take one Module 5 elective in the first semester. Module 5 has three elective subjects, offered on a rotating cycle: each year, two of the three will be available. The forecast for the coming years is as follows:

- 2026–2027: Communication Techniques and Data Interpretation and Visualization
- 2027–2028: Data Interpretation and Visualization and Research Methods
- 2028–2029: Research Methods and Communication Techniques

Since over the course of the degree you will need to take two of these three electives (one in the second year and one in the third year), we recommend that you consult the availability forecast in advance and plan which subjects you wish to take, bearing in mind that the same subjects will not be available every year.

SPECIALIZATIONS

The study plan provides for 5 specializations: Social Communication (SC), Regional Development (RD), Political Impact and Action (PIA), Inclusivity and Gender (IG), and Spatial Mobility (SM). To obtain a specialization you must complete 48 specific ECTS credits:

- 12 credits of electives from Modules 3 and 4
- 12 credits of electives from Module 8
- 12 credits of curricular internships
- 12 credits of the 4th-year Service Learning project (Rethinking Project)

When choosing your third-year elective subjects, please consider whether you wish to obtain one of the available specializations upon completing the degree, as the electives from Modules 3 and 4 are designed to fulfil the requirements of each specialization. The following table shows which subjects count towards each one:
