- Bachelor's degree programmes comprise 240 credits.
- A full academic year comprises 60 credits.
- The minimum number of credits you can enrol in during the first year is 30.
- Double degree programmes comprise more than 300 credits. You will find the information on the following pages.
- To continue on the same programme, all students must pass **subjects or modules worth a total of at least 30 credits during the first two academic years**. Otherwise, they will not be allowed to continue these studies at the UdG. Recognised credits are not counted for this purpose.
- You have **three examination opportunities** to pass each subject (one per academic year). **A "No show" grade counts as an examination opportunity used**; therefore, so that the opportunity is not counted, you may request its cancellation until the date established in the academic and administrative calendar for the 2026/2027 academic year.

***IMPORTANT: for scholarship purposes**, cancellation of an examination opportunity counts as a **subject not passed**.

SUBJECTS To obtain detailed information about each subject, click on the chosen bachelor's degree programme. You will find the drop-down list of subjects grouped by year. Clicking on a subject will show its details (groups, competences, contents, activities, bibliography, assessment and grading, tutorials).
