The MIJS's goals are:

- Offering advanced specialisation in working with young people and youth policies.
- Providing advanced training in research and youth studies.

5 reasons for choosing this Master's degree:

1. The only degree of its kind in the Spanish State
2. Taught at 6 public Catalan universities
3. Expert team of lecturers, guided by a Board of Advisers
4. An interdisciplinary, theoretical and practical approach, in the field of youth.
5. Free accommodation on the Youth Hostel Network during the Master's degree's classes, to make travel easier
6. The Master's degree includes a studies trip abroad

Duration: 60 ECTS credit; one academic year. The Master's degree can also be studied in two or three years and its credits divided up for each academic year.

Calendar and timetable

The Master's degree runs from October to July, in classes held mostly on Friday afternoons (4 pm to 9 pm) and Saturday mornings (9 am to 2 pm).

Subjects are taught at several universities, so students will have to sit each of subjects at the corresponding university and go to the six universities involved in the Master's degree. In practice, however, there is not so much travelling (three universities are in Barcelona). To make travel easier, the Catalan Youth Agency's Youth Hostels Network is available to provide students with free Friday-night accommodation where there are MIJS classes.

Professional prospects

Depending on the subject areas chosen and the pathway pursued during the Master's degree, the teaching received will provide the student with the skills for:

- Analysing, directing and managing youth programmes, centres and services.
- Analysing, directing and managing youth policies, with everything these involve in the analysis, design, application and evaluation of plans, programmes and projects.
- Direct action with young people. Youth work.
- The youth-studies research carried out includes epistemology, methodology and basic conceptualisations of youth and its main fields of research are history, education, economy, psychology, social participation, leisure, identity, consumption, health, communication and youth policies.

The education acquired will give students access to the following professional profiles: Youth officers, education officers, culture officers, youth animators, youth equipment and programme managers, directors and coordinators at youth services and institutions, intercultural mediation and dispute resolution, youth information officers and researchers in youth issues, among other professional profiles that young people have as recipients.

Pre-enrolment and enrolment for the 2019-2020 academic year

Pre-enrolment for the MIJS is open from February to September 2019. There is a limited number of places. Once their pre-enrolment has been accepted, students can then enrol. Hence the establishment of several enrolment periods, depending on the availability of places.
